





















We have a range of LED lighting and visual effects which can be used to enhance both the surrounding environment (walls, ceilings, floor and water surface) together with effects which can be used within the water. The selection of equipment will be based on physical considerations, that is the size of the area, how dark it is and of course your budget.

The physical dimensions of the space will also determine what type of equipment is suitable and safe to be installed into a swimming pool or hydrotherapy area. Depending upon what 'zones' exist in your environment will dictate the specification of electrically powered effects. A 'zone' has a physical parameter and only certain types of voltage and fittings can be used in specific 'zones'. There are three zones relating to swimming pool areas: 0, 1 and 2 and then the areas that do not fall into any of these zones - this is where control systems, audio and switches are normally located. Lighting effects can be installed in zones 1 and 2 subject to meeting strict electrical regulations in the UK. Locating equipment outside of zones 0, 1 and zone 2 (the furthest zone from the water) is preferable as there is a greater range of effects available and also less risk of the items coming into contact with water from splashes and hoses/jets.
