


Number fun! In maths we have loved exploring Numicon, building towers and exploring shapes and number songs.

Hedgehogs class have had a wonderful first term back. Everyone has settled so well and made fabulous progress in all areas.









It feels like we have blinked and the whole term has whizzed past in Seals class! Everyone should be feel incredibly proud of how well the children have adapted being back into the school routine after Lockdown 1.0 and the summer holidays. This term we have been focusing on the 'Recovery Curriculum' by supporting the pupils back into their learning as well adapting to the new school routines to ensure that we keep ourselves safe and healthy.











We have been learning about the Magic of Being Human which has included how to keep our bodies clean, how different foods affect our body and what does exercise do to our bodies. We've also enjoyed getting to paint on the walls too - some wonderful child lead learning.

Seals class have been doing fantastic work with our many different forms of communication including intensive interaction, eye contact, PECS, LAMP, vocalisation and building verbal sentences using SCERTS (The SCERTS® Model). We have also been building on our self regulation skills trying different ways to help keep calm as well as learning about making choices with our behaviour.

Herons' topic this term was on the theme of 'Water'. The class have had lots of fun learning about how water behaves! We have mixed oil and coloured water to learn about density and used the same principals to make experimental art! By making water wheels we began to understand the power of water. Herons' class also spent time learning about Archimedes including his water displacement theory and his invention which makes water travel uphill – Archimedes Screw. We made one of those in class, but it was very slow! The pupils enjoyed learning about and making his other inventions such as giant catapults! After learning about rivers we decided to look at the technology of bridges and tested different types of structure. The class were on the edge of the seat as we tested the truss bridge to destruction!




Otters class




Autumn term 2020





