The routine was stuck to every week in class	Each class has a weekly timetable for their curriculum and enrichment activities which is followed. As in all aspects of life things don't always stay the same and things do have to change around for all manner of reasons. In actual fact we sometimes 'sabotage' routines purposefully so that our pupils can develop their skills in coping with change. Class routines also change at different points in the year in response to whole school events and as the children's needs change.

Last school year we had significant roof repairs completed and replaced some pieces of outdoor equipment. Over this school year we have so far had our new security gates and fencing installed and other plans include; painting of a number of areas of the school, sensory room upgrade and playground refurbishment and there is the possibility of the garage spaces being converted.
