Here are the suggestions and the schools response.

The school could have more funding	Our funding is provided by the government and linked to the number of children on roll. We always take advantage of any grants that we can apply for also.
The school has more staff	From September we have continued to have 1 teacher and 3 TA's in each classroom.
The school runs summer camps / before school clubs.	Holiday provision is led by Halton Disabled Children Services. This is something that we will continually review. Breakfast club – due to very high number of children travelling by bus this is not something we are currently offering. We will undertake a research piece to gauge level of interest.
Method of seeing what children do daily through an online system / see for ourselves what the children do in class.	As a school we use a system called Evisense. This allows you to view photos / video of your child's work / activities that they have undertaken. Additionally we share children's activities through social media, our website and newsletters as well as your daily emails. When you attend parents evenings / annual reviews you will have opportunity to see work completed.
Better parking	Due to the limited outdoor space that we have at the Widnes site we are restricted to the car-parking available. To increase safety we have maintained the staggered start / end to ensure we have fewer vehicles in the car-park and also continue to have full access to the neighbouring church car-park.
The school expanded and taught high school age as well	Unfortunately our designation is only Primary age and there are no plans to expand!
The school was all under one roof.	Due to the continuing high level of demand for places we are working closely with the local authority to find a quality long term solution that will enable us to provide the required number of places for our community.
