
Butterflies



ELSA Update number 1

Welcome to the first-ever ELSA newsletter page, our names are Jody and Sarah, and we have both worked at Brookfields for many years. In April we were lucky enough to be given the opportunity to embark on training provided by Halton Educational Psychology service which ran for 6 weeks. The training was delivered by various Educational Psychologists who are based in Halton.

Over the course of the training, topics covered included;

- Loss and bereavement
- Emotional literacy
- Social skills
- Friendship issues
- Relationships
- Managing strong feelings
- Anxiety
- Bullying
- Conflict
- Emotional regulation
- Growth mindset
- Social stories

After the completion of the training, we undertook our first ELSA group work in June. Teachers refer pupils and work is designed for the individual and their identified needs. Throughout this half term, sessions have followed a structured timetable with pupils entering a safe space to complete tasks, the session last for roughly 1 hour. The session begins with a catch-up, hello and a feelings check-in. Pupils then access various games and books and this is to allow the group as peers to bond and staff to forge a relationship with the pupils. After the games, the pupils then complete the theme work for the current week. To finish the session pupil's, enjoy a nature mindfulness walk, yoga or a massage.

This group will 'graduate' from their ELSA session on Monday 17th July and we have a mindfulness walk in Victoria Park organised.
