

## **Brookfields Collective Worship Guidance**



It is a legal required that all pupils be given an invitation to participate in a daily act of Collective Worship. This has been in place since the Education Reform Act of 1998 with no amendments and remains statutory. The law states that pupils in special school should attend to these important times; sharing in the spiritual and moral ethos of the school "so far as practicable for all."

Each LA has a SACRE which outlines the statutory requirements for all school settings. For Collective Worship we follow the principles outlined by Halton SACRE and the Lancashire Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education 2021.

#### Aims

- Promote self-worth and the uniqueness of the individual
- Create an atmosphere where pupils' own beliefs are valued
- Allow pupils the opportunity to respond in a way that is meaningful and appropriate to them
- Demonstrate that Collective Worship is an important time within the school day
- Enhance the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of the whole school community.
- Promote occasions to experience "awe and wonder" about the world around us
- Based on the broad principles and values of Christianity yet be accessible to pupils of all religious affiliations, backgrounds and personal beliefs.

#### Delivery

- Daily Act of Worship (guidance states that CW should not always be at the same time each day but this is down to teacher discretion based on the cohort of children) between 5-15 minutes
- Opportunities for exploration of a set theme or focus, reflection, celebration and pupil participation
- Follow the sequence of- Gather, Listen, Respond and Go Forth
- Opportunities for child led worship
- Appropriate resources that support the stages of worship

Collective Worship must be inclusive, establish a sense of belonging to the school community and its values and visions, have a sense of occasion and promote spiritual, moral and cultural development.



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### **Planning**

Gather- How do participants gather respectfully?
 Is there movement to another area?
 How is a prayerful atmosphere created?
 Is there an invitation to participate?
 Does everyone feel welcome?

Sing 'Come and join the circle' as you make a circle.

Is the focus explained?



Ring the bells until everyone is seated in a circle ready to pray.



Listen- Is what they are listening to suitable?


What is being shared?

How is the 'reading' shared – role play, music, powerpoint?

Is it suitable for the participants?

Do participants listen attentively through use of sensory support or objects of reference?





• **Respond**- Is there appropriate participation in relation to learning needs and styles?

Is time given for individual silent reflection?

Are children invited to join in prayer?

Are adults good role models?

Did all adults present participate?

Are participants invited to respond in an appropriate manner in a variety of ways?

Reflect on the Word you have heard and create a composition using musical instruments, which expresses God's joy in us.



Paint a hand print and add to a carpet display by saying "You made every little part of me. I am alive. Thank you, Wonderful



Reflect on the Word you have heard and say a spontaneous prayer by passing around a heart/ stone/ pebble/ shell/ candle.







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• **Go Forth**- Does Worship conclude appropriately? How is the theme or focus shared? Can be message be taken away and shared with others?

Be an example of Jesus today – help someone in need, share with someone, be kind and patient, look after our world.



Greet someone with a smile,

And the name of it Brookfields enfolding us all


